Guwahati. Truly speaking, it is comprised of many revenue villages viz. ## A brief history of B.C.Medhi College, Ramdia



Binandi Chandra Medhi College, Ramdia (formerly known as Ramdia College) situated at Ramdia, an institution for higher education was established on August 13, 1992.

A group of dedicated persons covering the greater area of Ramdia, Bangalpara, Tokradia, Khetrihardia, Barhardia, Sobancha, Dampur etc. with their relentless and untiring effort has established Ramdia College to provide quality higher

education. Later on, the college was renamed as Binandi Chandra Medhi College, Ramdia as a gesture of gratitude. Formerly, the college started in Ramdia Puthibharal Aru Samuhik Sanskritik Kendra from 13th August 1992 and then shifted to its present location on 30th September 1994.

The College attained opening permission on 14th August 1993 and was temporarily affiliated to GU in 1994-95. The college also obtained permission for B.A. Part-I concurrence on 29th December 1999, obtained the Govt. concurrence up to B.A. Part-II level on 27th September 2004 and was provincialised in 2013 according to the Assam Govt's Venture Institution Provincialisation Act 2011. The college got permanent affiliation from GU on 18th December 2009 and was registered under society Act XXI of 1860 on 12th March 2012. The College is included under 2 (f) and 12 (B) of UGC Act. 1956 on 27th February, 2014.

The College got financial support from No. 1 Ramdia Samabai Samiti, public donation, theatrical performance, lottery etc. It is being funded by the UGC, No. 1 Ramdia Samabai Samiti, public donation etc. which helps to develop the infrastructure of the college. At present it gets financial support from the state government and University Grant Commission (UGC) for its overall development.

# Rules and Regulations

- Students admitted to the college must abide by the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority.

## Students' Attendance

The college takes students' attendance strictly in to account for the purpose of allowing students for academic awards and scholarships.

Each student is required to attend a minimum of 75% of the total classes held in each subject respectively in an academic session. If a student fails to attend classes for one month at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes his/her seat is liable to be forfeited. The parents and guardians will be issued monthly appraisal/up dated report of the students, works, and attendance. If at the end of three month duration their attendance is still insufficient (less than 75%), their admission will stand automatically cancelled.

## **Admission Procedure**

- The college advertises about the dates of admission to various classes through the college notice board.
- Students seeking admission into their respective classes should apply through prescribed form, which may be collected along with prospectus from the college office during office hours.
- Candidates are required to produce the following original documents at the time of admission for verification:
  - Marks sheet of the last qualifying examination.
  - Admit card of H.S.L.C./H.S.
  - Registration Certificate.
  - Certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
  - Gap certificate if necessary.
  - Certificate of proficiency in co-curricular activities.
    - Caste certificate where necessary.
- Major Admission will be confirmed after departmental entrance test.

# Key Points of Semester System

- A student will get maximum six years to complete his degree course. There will be no limit on the number of chances an applicant may appear in any of the semester examination provided that the course must be completed within the maximum period of six years.
- Students can apply for repeat examination in one of the theory papers in 1st, 2nd and 3rd semester examinations. The provision for repeat examination is not applicable for 4th, 5th and 6th semester examinations.
- Re evaluation of answer scripts should be addressed to the Deputy Controller of Examination, G.U. through the principal within 15 days from the date of declaration of results of the respective examination.
- Students passing in any paper(s) in a semester need to appear in the remaining papers (Failed or not appeared) in the next examination. Students passing in practical paper(s) of a subject need to appear only in theory paper(s) in the subsequent examination.
- It is mandatory for all the students to appear in Sessional Examinations. The minimum mark for passing in each paper is 30% of total marks.
